### Enrichment Days this half term

Our pupils spent the day carrying out activities about Children in Need. The older pupils delved into the history of Children in Need, who set it up and what people do to help. Across the lower school our pupils made pompoms, decorated biscuits and created Pudsey colourings.

Our first 'no pens day' was a great success. The pupils in upper school discussed Macbeth, debated parenthood and carried out some team-building exercises. Our younger pupils listened to various social stories, took part in role-play activities and used Numicon in maths.
