What have we been up to this half term?

The focus this half term has been on English.

In KS1, cognition and learning classes, our pupils have been exploring fables, they have really enjoyed reading the fables as a class and discussing the key messages within them.

They have looked at The Fox and the Stork and The Hare and the Tortoise.

In KS2, our pupils have been exploring The Butterfly Lion, comparing this to a story called Lob. Students explored descriptive writing and wrote a beautiful letter to one of the characters in The Butterfly Lion.

In KS3, students have been exploring how TV news production occurs. Students enjoyed looking at images and identifying direct and indirect information given. They are preparing to write their own news story script.

In KS4, students have been studying Lord of the Flies, discussing characters, events, civilisation and savagery! Our Y11 pupils have also been preparing for their GCSE's by completing their mock examinations. They should be really proud of how hard they have worked throughout these.








Inter-school Competitions
